

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT: BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION
BETWEEN DAWSON COMMUNITY COLLEGE
AND THE UNIVERSITY OF PROVIDENCE**

OVERVIEW:

This formal program articulation agreement is made and entered into by Dawson Community College, hereinafter referred to as DCC, and the University of Providence, hereinafter referred to as UP. By this agreement DCC and UP express a shared commitment to increasing opportunities for student access to and success in higher education.

PURPOSE:

This agreement provides DCC students who have completed the **Associate of Science** degree with articulated coursework in Business Administration the opportunity to complete a **Bachelor of Science in Business Administration** degree at UP. Any DCC student who has earned an Associate of Science degree with coursework that adheres to the guidelines within this agreement is guaranteed that UP will accept designated major related credits and that all general education credits will apply to the Bachelor of Science in Business Administration degree in a manner consistent with the treatment of native UP students.

CONDITIONS OF TRANSFER:

Section I: Admissions and Matriculation

DCC students maintaining continuous enrollment under this agreement will be afforded the same treatment and protection as native UP students enrolled under a specific catalog.

Criteria for acceptance into UP will be the same for transfer as for native students.

DCC, upon request of students, will provide verification of completed courses to UP through its Office of Admissions and Records. The transcript of students transferring from DCC will be evaluated by the Registrar's Office at UP.

Transfer students from DCC will have access to financial aid, scholarships, and student services on the same basis as native students.

UP will apply the same academic progress and graduation standards to DCC transfer students as those applicable to native students at UP.

Section II: Transfer of Credit

A maximum of 60 semester hours will be accepted by UP from DCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Science in Business Administration degree as outlined in this agreement.

Section III: Program Plan

While a course-by-course equivalence was used in the development of this plan, this agreement presumes that, other than courses noted on the attached course crosswalk, the general education



core requirements at DCC meet general education requirements at UP. Students falling under this program articulation agreement will be responsible for successfully completing the additional prescribed requirements to complete the University Core curriculum at UP.

TERMS of AGREEMENT:

This agreement is made and entered into in the academic year 2021-2022 and remains in force unless changed in writing by mutual agreement to both parties. The agreement may be amended at any time with the approval of both parties and is subject to annual review to assure currency with the respective degree requirements. Should either party desire to discontinue this agreement, advance notification of one year will be required.

Dawson Community College and the University of Providence hereby enter into this program articulation agreement leading from the Associate of Science degree with articulated coursework in Business Administration to the Bachelor of Science in Business Administration degree by the affixing of signatures of the chief executive officers of both institutions.

Special Notes, if any:

- University of Providence requires:
 - A minimum of 40% or 15 credits of the major (whichever is greater) must be earned in residency at the University of Providence
 - Thirty (30) of the final forty (40) credits earned for a bachelor's degree must be completed in residency at the University of Providence
 - Completion of a pre-existing Associates Degree, all courses within the Bachelor's core are waived except the following:
 - PHL 301 Ethics*, TRL 301 The Christian Life*, ILC 330 What is Truth OR ILC 350 What is the Common Good, ENG 300-319 (Upper Division Writing)
 - A cumulative grade point average (GPA) of at least 2.00 for courses taken while enrolled at University of Providence
 - At least 32 credits counted toward graduation be at the upper division (3XX-4XX) level.
 - Successful completion of the University of Providence graduation requirements for the Bachelor of Arts degree.
- The following limitations also apply:
 - Developmental courses shall not be counted toward graduation.

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
